

In our last Newsletter, I reported that James Conroy had achieved 100% in his ITIL exam. Our latest group of ITIL students went 'two' better: every single student passed the ITIL® V3 Service Capability – Release, Control & Validation industry certification exam and two students received a perfect score in the exam. The current international pass-rate for this exam is 82% and the performance of the students has again demonstrated the potential of the virtual classroom to match, and even exceed, the traditional face to face classroom.
